THE PROCESSION TO THE SYCAMORE TREE (Liturgy of the Word for Children)

Children are welcome to stay with their parents in church, or they are welcome to join in the Sycamore Tree where they will share the Word of God in an active way meant especially for them. The children will return at the time of the Baptism. The name "Sycamore Tree" comes from the story in Luke's Gospel, where Zaccheus, who was too small to see Jesus above the crowds, climbed a sycamore tree so he could see Jesus too. If you have children who wish to participate, have them join the procession.

Celebrant: The glory of God fills the house of God.

**People:** *God's children declare God's glory.*

Celebrant: Process with joy into the Liturgy of the Word.

**People:** *Thanks be to God.*

*The people sit.*

THE FIRST LESSON: Revelation 7:9-17

**A**fter this I, John, looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!" And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, singing, "Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God forever and ever! Amen." Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, "Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?" I said to him, "Sir, you are the one that knows." Then he said to me, "These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

**W**hen Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and after he sat down, his disciples came to him. THE SERMON – The Rev. Amy E. Richter, PhD, Rector of St. Anne’s Church

PRESENTATION AND EXAMINATION OF THE BAPTISMAL CANDIDATES

Celebrant: The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*The candidates who are unable to answer for themselves are presented individually by their Parents and Godparents, as follows*

**Parents and Godparents:** I present (Name) to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*When all have been presented the Celebrant asks the parents and godparents*

Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

**Parents and Godparents:** I will, with God's help.

Celebrant: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

**Parents and Godparents:** I will, with God's help.

*Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the parents and godparents who speak on behalf of the infants and younger children*

**Question:** Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

**Answer:** *I renounce them.*

**Question:** Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

**Answer:** *I renounce them.*

**Question:** Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

**Answer:** *I renounce them.*

**Question:** Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

**Answer:** *I do.*

**Question:** Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

**Answer:** *I do.*

**Question:** Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

**Answer:** *I do.*

*As you are able, please stand. After all have been presented, the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying*  
Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support *these persons* in *their* life in Christ?

**People:** ***We will.***

*The Celebrant then says:*

Let us join with *those* who are committing *themselves* to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

## THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

**Celebrant:** Do you believe in God the Father?

**People:** ***I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.***

**Celebrant:** Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

**People:** ***I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.***

**Celebrant:** Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

**People:** ***I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.***

**Celebrant:** Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

**People:** ***I will, with God's help.***

**Celebrant:** Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

**People:** ***I will, with God's help.***

**Celebrant:** Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

**People:** ***I will, with God's help.***

**Celebrant:** Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

**People:** ***I will, with God's help.***

**Celebrant:** Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

**People:** ***I will, with God's help.***

## PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATES

*The Celebrant then says to the congregation*

Let us now pray for *these persons* who *are* to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

*A Person appointed leads the following petitions*

**Leader:** Deliver *them*, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

**People:** ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

**Leader:** Open *their hearts* to your grace and truth.

**People:** ***Lord, hear our prayer.***

*Leader:* Fill *them* with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

*People:* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader:* Keep *them* in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

*People:* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader:* Teach *them* to love others in the power of the Spirit.

*People:* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader:* Send *them* into the world in witness to your love.

*People:* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*Leader:* Bring *them* to the fullness of your peace and glory.

*People:* **Lord, hear our prayer.**

*The Celebrant says*

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever. **Amen.**

*The congregation may be seated.*

### THE BAPTISM

Each candidate is baptized and sealed by the Holy Spirit with these words:

(Name), I baptize you in the Name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

(Name), you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

*After all of the candidates have been baptized we stand and sing HYMN 490 as follows*

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."
